Dear Parents and Caregivers of Good Shepherd Catholic School

We have arrived at the end of Semester One. As I mentioned in last week's newsletter, it has been one like no other. I would like to thank all our families for the support that they have given the school during this time. Your words of encouragement and praise have been appreciated by all the staff. I would like to thank the staff for the outstanding work they have carried out. They have worked hard to ensure that the needs of our students have remained at the forefront of their decision making. Their willingness to do that little bit extra has helped our students to be as settled as possible during this time. They certainly deserve the break that begins this afternoon.

I would like to take this opportunity to wish Mrs Iolanda Jennings all the very best as she prepares for the birth of her first child. This is a very special time for both her and her husband and we wish them all the joys that parenthood brings. Mrs Tara Ryan has been employed to work with the students in Year 2W and we will welcome her to her our school at the beginning of Term 3. Mrs Manifold, who has been working with the Year 2W students on a Thursday, will no longer be working with them and will spend this time working in other parts of the school. We thank her for her contribution to this class and look forward to her work with our special needs students.

By now all families would have received their child's report for semester one. An opportunity to discuss your child's report will be made available to you during Week One of Term Three. Please contact your child's teacher to organise a mutually agreeable time. I would like to thank the staff for the time and effort they have put into completing reports that are very informative and give a clear indication of student progress. I would like to bring to your attention that there has been an issue with the reporting software that has incorrectly recorded the number of student half day absences. This is being rectified and new reports will become available through the parent portal as soon as possible. The only changes to the report will be the recording of absences. No other data will be changed.

During the school holidays (July 17), the Premier of WA is scheduled to make an announcement on Phase 5 on the road map to recovery from COVID-19. It is our expectation that life will return to its new 'normal'. This will mean that, with relaxed physical distancing measures, we will return to having whole school gatherings. Please check the school calendar for Term Three to see when events, such as assemblies and school Masses, will take place. Parents will also be welcomed back into classrooms before

and after school and will be able to remain on school grounds for specific reasons (canteen help, classroom help). We look forward to these measures coming into effect.

Thank you to the many parents and caregivers who follow our car park rules. Thank you to those who are courteous of other drivers and are aware of the rules of drive through and drive around the block, sometimes 3 times, without complaining. The staff that are on duty really appreciate this. There are still a minority of families who insist on not following rules which ultimately puts student lives in danger. We have a designated pedestrian crossing that is clearly signposted and is managed by a staff member both in the morning and afternoon. Despite this, we still have people crossing the drive through in unauthorised areas. Earlier last week we had a very close encounter whereby a child only just missed being hit by a car. This could have been a very nasty accident and those who witnessed it were very distressed. Please do not cross the driveway other than by the designated crossing because that is where drivers are expecting people to cross. Please do not park at the priest's house because it is dangerous to cross the road there. Although some of these things can be inconvenient ultimately, they keep our children safe from harm. I would also remind you that if you need to get out of your car in the drop off/pickup zone, please park in a designated carpark bay. Thank you to all our families for your assistance and cooperation.

I would like to wish all our families a very relaxing and enjoyable break from school routine. We look forward to welcoming you all back on Monday 20<sup>th</sup> July.

## Administration of Schools (AoS)

### Administration of Schools (AoS)

Catholic Education Western Australia (CEWA) has committed to a new Administration software platform that has been a work in progress for the last couple of years. As the demands of modern schools increase, the services required to support schools increase faster still. AoS (Admin of Schools) is a comprehensive engine designed to integrate all of these services and unite them in one central management system. Good Shepherd School have been working with staff from CEWA in preparation for the installation of AoS, to replace our current Administration system. Please be aware that this will occur as of Friday 24<sup>th</sup> July. There will be several changes such as a new BPAY reference number and SEQTA logins.

**BPAY reference number:** We will send you a Fee Statement showing your current balance and updates payment details in the coming weeks. Please take note of your new BPAY reference number on the attached Fee Statement. Prior to making any BPAY payments, please update your bank account details to the new BPAY reference number.

**SEQTA Engage:** We will send Parents/Carers a link to setup their accounts. All families are required to setup their new account within a week of receiving the link in order to access past reports. Please ensure you keep your username and password, in order to use this again at the end of the year. We appreciate your patience during the transition period.

You are **only** required to complete the survey if your circumstances have changed since the enrolment of your child/children. Families with siblings are required to complete the survey for each child.
